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Minutes of Riley Club of Qld General Meeting, Held on 11th April, 2013

At the Jack Warr Riley Shed in Samford

- 1. The President declared the Meeting open at 8.15.
- 2. Attendance As per attendance sheet. A total of 13 members were in attendance.
- **3. Apologies** were received from Ian Henderson, Del Thomson, Ray and Bev Burrows, Lyn and Brian Jackson, Dorothy Cameron, Ross and Di Phillips, Jack Warr and Matthew French.
- **4. Minutes** of the General Meeting held on Thursday 14th March, 2013 were circulated. The minutes were moved for adoption as a true and correct record of the meeting by Alan Hill and seconded by Rod Longden, Carried.
- 5. **Business Arising:** Although it was agreed that the minutes of the previous general meeting reflected what was actually said, it was also agreed that the motion related to sending out electronic copies of the Torque Tube was not what was intended.

The Wonderful Inaugural Central Queensland Rally

What started off from a little gem of an idea for the Southern Rileyites to meet the Northern Rileyites came to fruition in a week long Rally in April. Robin and Barbara Hull put in a huge effort to make this a memorable occasion. 5 x RMB's, a 1.5 and 2 x moderns set off to meet up with 3 x RMB's from Townsville. We travelled on the inland roads north through Kilcoy with our first overnight stop at Gayndah. We visited a Citroen aficionado in the town and after initially being rendered speechless at the number and quality of his collection enjoyed some serious car inspections. This gentleman had at least 30 Citroens, mostly different models, some extremely rare in





immaculate condition and ranging in value from \$18,000 to \$330,000!

Everywhere, the countryside was at its utmost best after the rains and floods with sleek cattle grazing on shoulder high grasses. Evidence of the recent floods and hardships for the locals was evident with debris half way up tall trees, fences pushed over and damage to roads and bridges. For the second day of driving, we morning tea'd at Eidsvold where the locals admired the Rileys and the local newspaper lady photographed the cars and some Riley Members for publication in "The Eidsvold News"! – we have really made the big time! After lunch in Biloela, we arrived and settled into cabins in Rockhampton and met up with our Townsville Rileyites. After dining at the local Services Club, some of us were caught in a huge cloud burst returning to our base in a mini bus.

Next day, our third, Robin cracked the whip and had us all driving out to Mount Morgan for the day. Mount Morgan is an historic town, founded on rich gold deposits – we were welcomed at the old historic railway station by volunteers who freely shared information on the railway and the town. We had the opportunity to head off on a mine and town tour with

an excellent commentary after seeing the old infrastructure of the railway station, the yards, tracks and wagons. That evening back in Rockhampton, we self catered which gave us all an excellent opportunity for camaraderie and Riley-talk! The fellows did an excellent job of barbequing and certainly there were no complaints from the women!

During our last day in Rockhampton, we had been contacted by Ian Ripley who had bought the 1936 Riley Falcon from South Australia recently advertised in the Torque Tube and he drove it around – his first drive since it had arrived in Queensland and became registered. Ian owns a 1967 Kestrel and a white RMB, ex Caboolture. The Falcon is immaculate, inside and out and was hugely admired by Members. The general consensus was that our Rileys could do with a lot of housekeeping to lift the standard!

We farewelled our Northern Riley friends on Monday morning, they to return to Townsville and we to return to the south.





Definitely a convoy of the best looking cars on the road. All arrived home safely with just a few mechanical problems on the way to keep our blokes happy. ie Bill and Maria– starter motor problems and push starts required Ken & Wendy – fan belt came adrift which allowed the fan to move forward to munch into the radiator. Fortunately picked up before too much damage Bill & Beverley – Stone chip & cooling fan failure therefore over heating and oil leak through the front seal Ron & Heather – Starter motor solenoid overheating (too close to the exhaust) Mal – fuel pump problems, also ran out of fuel!

Robin & Barbara – No problems Stuart & Miriam – No problems Mick & Lyn – No problems Alan & Sheila – ran out of fuel!

In no way did these little things detract from a fantastic rally. It was thoroughly enjoyed by all participants and many thanks to Robyn and Barbara for organising it. "Gotta do it again" was the unanimous decision!!

Tyre Replacement With Radials

Since the post war Riley steering geometry usually takes the car in the direction steering points it. Changing wheel and tyre size may alter the wheel offset and change this capability.

The 195/80 R 16 may be a perfect replacement type. A ready supply of this tyre could be a good prospect.

I recently attended the Australian Street Rod Nationals on the Gold Coast and came across this interesting 32 Ford Roadster owned by Tony Carter of Maryborough. He is a coach builder and has a business at Maryborough where he works on a variety of interesting cars. He formerly had a workshop in Melbourne and his album includes pictures of bodies for historic racing cars, Aston Martins and Rileys to name a few. He even had pictures of a Riley Roadster that he had done the body work on. Prior to that he had worked for Tomasini, probably one the most notable quality vintage car restorers in the country.

Tony had built the windscreen, roof and bonnet for this car from scratch. The roof was made from nine separate panels all beautifully welded together so that it appears to be a single sheet. There is not a single fault in the curvature. He has several projects on the go but has the capacity for more. There are very few people in Queensland that can do this standard of work and those that do have long waiting lists. I thought it may be worthwhile bringing this to the attention of club members who may be needing some quality work done or perhaps building a special. His hourly rate is a reasonable \$70/hour.
