Club Spares has acquired a supply of near-new modern 6.00x16 inch safety rims suitable for modern radial-ply tyres. The rims fit RM centres near perfectly. Price \$20 each. Contact Jack on 07 3378 3541.

Tyre Options For RM Rileys:

Through to the 1980's, the Olympic Air Ride was the tyre of choice for most RM owners with a few discerning opting for exotic brands such as Avon Turbospeed or even Michelin X radials. That all changed in the early 1990's with these options either disappearing or becoming prohibitively expensive. Cheap radials from Falken and others offered improvements in ride and the future looked bright. Unfortunately these 175/80 x16 tyres are no longer being imported by the tyre companies as the demand is not great enough.

Owners essentially have two options:

1) purchase classic tyres from companies such as Antique Tyres that fit the 4.5" x 16" rims of the RMA-F (5" x 16" on RMH). For example:

These tyres are made specifically for classic cars.

2) purchase from the range of light commercial tyres available from the mainstream tyre companies. For example:

Brand & Type	<u>Size</u>	<u>Overall Diameter</u>	<u>Price</u>
Bridgestone 613V	195/75R16C	700mm	\$250
Nankang CW-20	185/75R16C	684mm	\$138

These tyres require minimum rim widths of 5" for 185 and 5.5" for 195 section tyres. You have to decide whether a legal or insurance issue may arise if you have them fitted onto 4.5" rims contrary to tyre manufacturers' specifications._

The way to avoid these issues is to consider upgrading your wheels to take a larger width rim. The narrowest 16" rims made are 6" wide and are fitted to numerous 4WD commercial vehicles and an increasing number of passenger vehicles. Passenger vehicle rims are made of thinner steel and are significantly lighter than the 4WD variety providing advantages from lower unsprung weight.

As no new vehicle sold in Australia uses the same 4³/₄" PCD as the RMA–F (Jaguar XJ-6, HQ – WB Holden and Chevrolet are some that did) the original Riley centre has to be used with a replacement outer rim. Obviously it has to be a good fit so check before buying. You don't need to be able to use a ruler, just try the Riley centre in the rim. The other consideration is the assembled offset as large variations here will affect steering geometry. The early Navara rims that have been used for some years result in a track increase of 1" with

no apparent problems but they are heavy. Holden Rodeo are a close fit as are Mitsubishi Triton.



The photo shows another possible alternative 6"x 16" rim from a Mazda car fitted to a Riley RMA–F centre. This rim is significantly lighter and assembles with no change to offset over the standard Riley wheel. This means that the inner edge is ³/₄" closer to the chassis and the outer edge is ³/₄" closer to the mudguard. Some sedans show signs of tyre rubbing against the inner rear wheel arch which may occur under large roll angles so this combination may be a problem on sedans. Roadsters do not seem to experience this. If anyone would like to try this combination rims are available from All Wheels at \$20 each. Call Geoff on 0409063663.
